KEY INGREDIENTS: AMERICA BY FOOD- THE GEORGIA TOUR

Fact Sheet

- WHAT:** *Key Ingredients: America by Food* is a traveling exhibition that examines the evolution of the American kitchen and American food culture and traditions through a selection of artifacts, photographs and illustrations. It also looks at how food industries have responded to the technological innovations enabling Americans to choose from an ever-wider variety of foods.
- WHO:** Key Ingredients is part of Museum on Main Street, a collaboration between the Smithsonian Institution and the Federation of State Humanities Councils. This Georgia tour has been made possible by the Georgia Humanities Council with additional support from the Georgia Power Foundation, the Georgia Tourism Foundation, Trucks Incorporated, and the *We the People* initiative of the National Endowment for the Humanities. Support for Museum on Main Street has been provided by the United States Congress, the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation, and the Hearst Foundation.
- HOW:** The Georgia Humanities Council is bringing the exhibit to Georgia. Twelve local hosts (below) will display the exhibit and coordinate programming, such as festivals, cook-offs, author visits and more as the exhibit travels the state.
